	1) RRB thanked the following for support and commitment:

2) RRB recapped membership Growth:

- Club has 175 members, with new individuals joining weekly.
- RRB recognised returning members studying at university as testament to the EO community built

3) Leadership Updates:

- RRB thanked Sarah Biss for stepping into the role of interim Head Coach, supported by Rochelle Reynolds-Blanche, Val Hollingsworth and Sophia Sefton.
- Despite efforts to recruit a head coach, the post is still vacant and RRB requested all present to encourage suitable applications.

4) Highlights of 2023/2024:

- **Bursary Scheme:** Bursary scheme is functioning well, providing support accessible through team coaches.
- **Essex Open Tournament:** This event was a resounding success, showcasing the commitment of players, parents, and friends.
- **RRB congratulated** all the newly qualified coaches and umpires including young players obtaining their 'Into Officiating' qualifications.
- The Development Squad for integrating younger players and those looking to refine their skills before entering main squads.
- RRB stated EO is becoming a more competitive club, entering various leagues, including ENG, L&SE, and Sister n Sport leagues, which better prepare for future national competitions.

5) **Team Highlights:**

U10s and U11s:

- U11s now have a Blues Team, with several players receiving opportunities to compete at higher levels.
- Notable achievements include winning their group in the ENG competition and a fusion match, with Alice Horgan being named MVP of the tournament.
- U11s finished first in the Summer League, with the U10s coming in second.

U12s:

 won the U13 Essex Met League and had impressive finishes in several tournaments.

U13s:

- maroons played up in the U14 Met league, qualifying for the A league after round 1 and finished 3rd with a goal difference of just 1 goal.
- competed in the U14 regional qualifying round and made it through to compete in the 2024-25 London and South-East league.
- blues competed in their own age group of the Essex Met league and also qualified for the A league after round 1 with a mix of wins and losses finishing mid table.

U14s:

- finalists in the ENG and Nationals, and qualified for U16s Regionals, with standout performances including Renee Hurley winning MVP for South East league.
- 2nd Fusion Tournament (U15s)
- 1st Essex Open Tournament
- 1st Sabina Tournament
- 1st London Youth Games (all our U14s) Renee Hurley won MVP for whole tournament
- Renee Hurley and Atronna Sebyala continue to be in U17 Players Development programme (PDP)

Seniors:

- first team finished an impressive second in the first division only three losses throughout the season.
- second, third, and fourth teams faced a slow start but improved significantly, finishing mid-table.
- fifth team, after a challenging season, benefitted from playing in a lower division, while the sixth team managed to secure their place after a close finish.
